Please begin by carefully reading and studying Chapter 13, about the increasing sectionalism in America, as cultures and values in different regions grew apart, and about Henry Clay's proposal of a compromise (compromise of 1850) that he hoped would keep the bitter conflict from getting worse. Review our prior chapters 10 section 3 and 13 that dealt with the differences between the North and the South in terms of their cultures, economies, industries and values, as well as the Missouri compromise (323) and other issues and solutions related to sectionalism. If you need to do some more research on the rise of sectionalism you may. Take notes to document your research and review. Then use this knowledge to plan and create a hanging mobile that uses the physical theme of balance to demonstrate the delicate between the needs and differences between the north and South during the first half of the 19th century. It should hang down at least 2 feet, and have at least six separate hanging components that show specific information. For example, you might have panels that show the, etc. in the North at one end and in the South at the other. It might also include a time line that shows the different methods each section used to protect its way of life, and when they were enacted.
