_____	_____ 18. Number of members in the house is based on the state's population.
_____	_____ 19. Elected for six year terms.
_____	_____ 20. Must keep an official record of its proceedings.
_____	_____ 21. Elected for two year term.
_____	_____ 22. Must keep an official record of its proceedings.
_____	_____ 23. Must live in the state from which they are elected.
